| <b>Cybersecurity</b>             | Keeping computers and information safe from harm.         | The protection of internet-connected systems and data from cyberattacks.                       |
| <b>Firewall</b>                  | A digital wall that keeps bad stuff out of your computer. | A security system that monitors and controls incoming and outgoing network traffic.            |
| <b>Malware</b>                   | Bad software that can harm your computer.                 | Software designed to disrupt or damage a computer system.                                      |
| <b>Phishing</b>                  | A trick to steal your information, like a fake email.     | A fraudulent attempt to obtain sensitive information by disguising it as a trustworthy entity. |
| <b>Encryption</b>                | Scrambling data so only the right person can read it.     | The process of converting data into a code to prevent unauthorized access.                     |
| <b>Password</b>                  | A secret word to log into a device or website.            | A string of characters used to verify a user's identity.                                       |
| <b>Hacker</b>                    | Someone who breaks into computers.                        | A person who uses computers to gain unauthorized access to data.                               |
| <b>Network</b>                   | A group of connected computers.                           | A digital telecommunications network which allows nodes to share resources.                    |
| <b>Virus</b>                     | A program that can make your computer sick.               | A type of malicious software that replicates and spreads.                                      |
| <b>Two-Factor Authentication</b> | A second step to prove it's you logging in.               | A security process where a user provides two different authentication factors.                 |
| <b>Antivirus</b>                 | A tool that protects your computer from bad programs.     | Software that detects and removes computer viruses.  |
| <b>Data Breach</b>               | When secret information is stolen.                        | An incident in which sensitive, protected data is accessed or disclosed without authorization. |
| <b>Cloud Computing</b>           | Using the internet to save and access files.              | Delivery of different services through the Internet.   |
